



Professor Terry Nolan

Head of Vaccine and Immunization Research Group, Peter Doherty Institute

Professor Terry Nolan AO FAHMS is a pediatrician and clinical epidemiologist, a medical graduate of the University of Western Australia, trained in pediatrics at the Royal Children's Hospital in Melbourne and at the Montréal Children's Hospital, with a PhD in epidemiology and biostatistics at McGill University in Montréal. He established the Clinical Epidemiology and Biostatistics Unit at the Royal Children's Hospital in 1989, was promoted to Professor in 1999 and became Deputy Head of Pediatrics within the School of Medicine, and in 2001 was appointed Foundation Head of the Melbourne School of Population and Global Health. He was Associate Director of the Murdoch Children's Research Institute in the late 1990s, and has continued an appointment to MCRl as a Professorial Research Fellow and head of the Vaccine and Immunization Research Group (VIRGo) since then. His research has been principally in immunization and clinical trials of new vaccines. He has over 240 publications in refereed journals. He has considerable experience in working with both Australian and New Zealand Governments and with the World Health Organization in the provision of policy advice. He served for 9 years on NHMRC's Research Committee, including a 3-year term as its Deputy Chair. He chaired ATAGI for 9 years. He served a 6-year appointment on the WHO principal global advisory group on immunization, SAGE (Scientific Advisory Group of Experts).
