WHO resolution on social participation for universal health coverage, health and wellbeing

At World Health Assembly 77 (WHA77), May 27 - June 1, the assembly adopted the resolution for social participation for universal health coverage (UHC). The resolution recalls the 2023 UN General Assembly's political declaration on UHC which promotes participatory, inclusive approaches to health governance for UHC. It highlights the role of participation in empowering people and communities, enhancing inclusive and transparent decision making, the need to promote the participation of people who are vulnerable and/or marginalised and the variety of mechanisms for facilitating two-way dialogue between governments and people, communities and civil society. It also notes that need to monitor and evaluate participation.

Through the long sitting day numerous countries and non-State actors spoke in support of social participation expressing beliefs that it would play a role in improving health literacy, reducing misinformation, improving decision making and hastening UHC.

HTAi is a WHO non State actor and was represented at WHA77 by our Outgoing Chair, HTAi Vice-President Ann Single. You can read more about the resolution <u>here</u>.

Celebrating 25 years of NICE

For 25 years, NICE has helped practitioners and commissioners get the best care to people fast, while ensuring value to the taxpayer.

International Recognition Procedure seeks to speed up licensing process

Developers of new medicines can now submit licensing applications through the Medicines and Healthcare products Regulatory Agency's (MHRA) new International Recognition Procedure (IRP). NICE will continue conducting timely appraisals for medicines which receive regulatory approval through the IRP.

IRP is expected to improve patient access to new medicines for UK patients. It allows the UK Medicines and Healthcare products Regulatory Agency (MHRA) to consider the expertise of trusted regulatory partners around the world.

Priorities 2024 Conference

At the beginning of May 2024, the Priorities 2024 Conference was held in Bangkok, Thailand. This year's theme was 'shaping the future of health prioritisation: strategies for sustainable solutions'. Hugh McGuire, senior adviser in our NICE Advice team, delivered the results of a study assessing the value of NICE Advice to pharmaceutical and healthtech companies seeking to enter the NHS market.

Free training on 'Assessing healthcare using outcomes that matter to patients'

We've teamed up with the European Health Data Evidence Network (EHDEN) Academy to offer an online course on assessing healthcare using outcomes that matter to patients. It covers:

patient health outcomes and why they're important

standardisation of measurement

data for benchmarking.

The course is free but you'll need to set up an EHDEN Academy account and log in to access it. It's quick and easy to do.

Development and Harmonisation of Methodologies for Assessing Digital Health Technologies in Europe (ASSESS DHT) https://assess-dht.eu/

NICE is a partner in ASSESS DHT. It's a European project that aims to increase the adoption of trustworthy and effective digital health technologies. As part of the project, we're developing a tool to help developers identify evidence gaps and optimise their evidence generation plans. We are also working with partners to develop an interim manual for digital health technology assessment. We'll pilot its use by assessing an Albased digital health app.

FDA platform designation guidance out for consultation

To speed up drug applications, the FDA has laid out <u>new guidance</u> on how to request a platform designation that can smooth subsequent applications for biotechs working off the same reproducible technology. The agency defines a platform technology as any well-understood reproducible technology, including a nucleic acid sequence, molecular structure, mechanism of action, delivery method, vector or a combination of these. This is especially key for companies in the gene editing space, where a platform can create multiple treatments for multiple different genes.

The new guidance explains that once a sponsor receives an abbreviated new drug application (ANDA), new drug application (NDA) or biologics license application (BLA) for a treatment, they can then request a platform designation. The guidance was created by the FDA's Center for Drug Evaluation and Research (CDER) and the Center for Biologics Evaluation and Research (CBER). The FDA is accepting comments on the platform designation guidance until July 29.

World Health Assembly endorses resolution on social participation

At the 77th World Health Assembly (WHA), Member States endorsed a resolution to implement, strengthen and sustain regular and meaningful social participation in decision-making processes for health. Social participation means empowering people, communities and civil society through inclusive participation in decision-making processes that affect health across the policy cycle and at all levels of the system.

IPPOSI launched the recruitment phase of its third Citizens' Jury initiative

IPPOSI is inviting 25 members of the public to explore the question: "Should we increase the use of AI (Artificial Intelligence) in health care in Ireland?"

As with previous juries, in order to achieve the target of a representative sample of the population of the Republic of Ireland (based on the latest census data), we need as many people as possible, from as diverse a reach as possible, to apply to become a juror.
